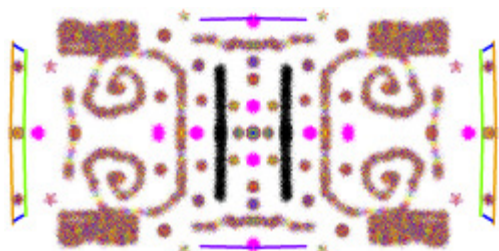
*Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School
